

Ramblings

Hesston has a former pastor who, for many years, deaned a camp for high school students at Camp Lakeside where I served as program director and as director. The camp was focused on the elements of building Christian community and activities were planned to practice living as a Christian community. An important element of the camp was learning to listen for understanding. The practice of this activity required focused effort on the part of both the listener and the speaker, because if the listener was truly listening for understanding, but failing to understand then there was a required effort on the part of the speaker to rephrase what was being said to facilitate understanding. On the other hand, the listener, in order to understand had to surrender concern for their own viewpoint in order to refrain from focusing on their response while the speaker was still speaking. Sometimes it seems that the modern church is so busy shouting its preconceived judgments at one another that it is losing the ability to listen and speak for understanding.

I grew up in a time and place where language expressed an inner worldview that was largely racist, sexist, nationalist, and generally parochial. There were games that were played, songs that were sung, nicknames employed, and thoughts expressed that used terms which were racially and culturally derogatory to various groups, identified genders as appropriately superior or inferior, chose to openly trust or distrust or value individuals based on their national or cultural origin, and generally valued all things close to home more than those further away geographically or conceptually. These factors inhibited listening and speaking for understanding.

During my college and early professional years I experienced the cultural revolution of the late '60's and early '70's which identified many of these characteristics as problematic for any society and was retrained to be more sensitive to words that hurt and words that heal (the title of a popular book of the 80's). Gone was the old adage, "Sticks and stones may break my bones, but words can never hurt me." Most folks came to agree that, indeed, words could hurt and hurt deeply. The pendulum of cultural sensitivity began to swing, and then increased its swing, and, perhaps, continues to swing. Political correctness contains within it important seeds of compassion and tolerance. There is a responsibility among those who speak to seek to use language that is respectful and appropriate. It is still, however, important to listen for understanding if real communication is to occur and the important part of that is understanding, more than the words. Sometimes we give words more power than they deserve. Remember, words are just sounds intended to convey meaning. If we can understand the intent of the speaker the sounds have accomplished their purpose. Using the sounds as a "gotcha" tool of manipulation or judgment does not advance the ministry of Christ. I have listened to pundits discuss the insulting nature of some words used by people in public or private life and have not been able to understand what would be offensive about them. On some occasions, I have asked and essentially been told that if I have to ask I am beyond redemption. Jesus took on the form of humanity in order to be understood. His life and teaching clearly demonstrated that He understands. As a fellow traveler on the road of faith I hope you will help me phrase my speech so it is more easily understood and I hope you will be patient and merciful with me as I seek to understand, and I hope we will all pray that our Lord will transform our hearts so that we speak and listen for understanding. See you in church.




APRIL MISSION CHILDREN AND YOUTH
