Ramblings

I heard someone telling a story the other day about a preacher who was asked if he had ever preached from the book of Jonah (which, virtually all preachers have) and he answered, "Yes, and I've also preached from Nahum." If I've preached from Nahum, I don't remember it. My comment at the time was, "I haven't preached from it, but I have it memorized." No one believed me, nor should they have believed me.

I've given more than half of my life to the study of God's word and I feel as though I have barely scratched the surface. Most of the time, I feel inadequate to talk about it (though, as you know, I do endlessly) because I am so aware of how inadequate my knowledge is. My congregation pays me to study the scriptures and interpret them in a way that allows for the revealing of God's intent through them, and here I am feeling extremely inadequate to do so.

The truth is, I am inadequate to clearly understand what God intends in the scripture. So are you. Despite the fact that God created us to be in relationship with one another and with God (Genesis 2 and 3), our "falleness" has resulted in our inability to know God's mind. Study won't change that. The corruption of our minds is just one of the effects of the condition of sin (or separation from God). If I had Nahum memorized, that, in itself, wouldn't help.

Ah... but there is a remedy provided by God. God has said, in effect, that if you put your trust in Jesus, I (God) will give you the benefit of my Spirit, who will reveal what is in my mind to you and I will do this so you can share it with others. Well, then, if God's own Spirit will help, then I need to put my trust in Jesus and get about the work of reading and studying Nahum and the rest of the books of Scripture as well. As a matter of fact, if God's Spirit is here to help, then I need to rely on the Holy Spirit to help me know how to vote at annual conference, and how to relate to the staff at HUMC, and how to treat my wife, and how to love you, and ... well, how to live every facet of my life.

We are leaving the season of Easter. Jesus is alive and well, Praise God! We are entering the season of Pentecost when we celebrate the gift of God's own Holy Spirit to the church. Let's make this season of Pentecost especially meaningful by trusting God's own Spirit to lead us into the truth of Christ. See you in Church!
